## Class-Artists in Action Grades 1/2 Lesson-Tree Art Teacher-Kaleen Chatigny

The purpose of this lesson to teach students how to paint an autumn tree.

Materials 1 pencil 1 black crayon or black sharpie 1 box of crayons 1 set of watercolors paints or finger-paints 1 9 x 12 sheet of construction paper

Introduction For this lesson students will first listen to a read aloud of the book, *Sky Color*, by Peter Reynolds

## Steps

- 1. First have you child trace their hand and arm on a piece of paper. They may need help tracing their hand, trace it about half-way up to the elbow.
- 2. Next have your child trace over the pencil with either a black crayon or black sharpie. This is the outline of the tree trunk.
- 3. Then have your child decide if they would like to either color in the trunk with a brown crayon or paint.
- 4. Finally, using the watercolor or finger- paints have your child paint the leaves of the autumn tree using green, red, yellow and orange.
- 5. Once this is dry they can add a watercolor wash for a blue sky and green for grass around the trunk.

## Extension

There are many other books by Peter Reynolds you may enjoy reading to your child.
