The purpose of this lesson is to make a colorful name tag to put on display in your art or school area.

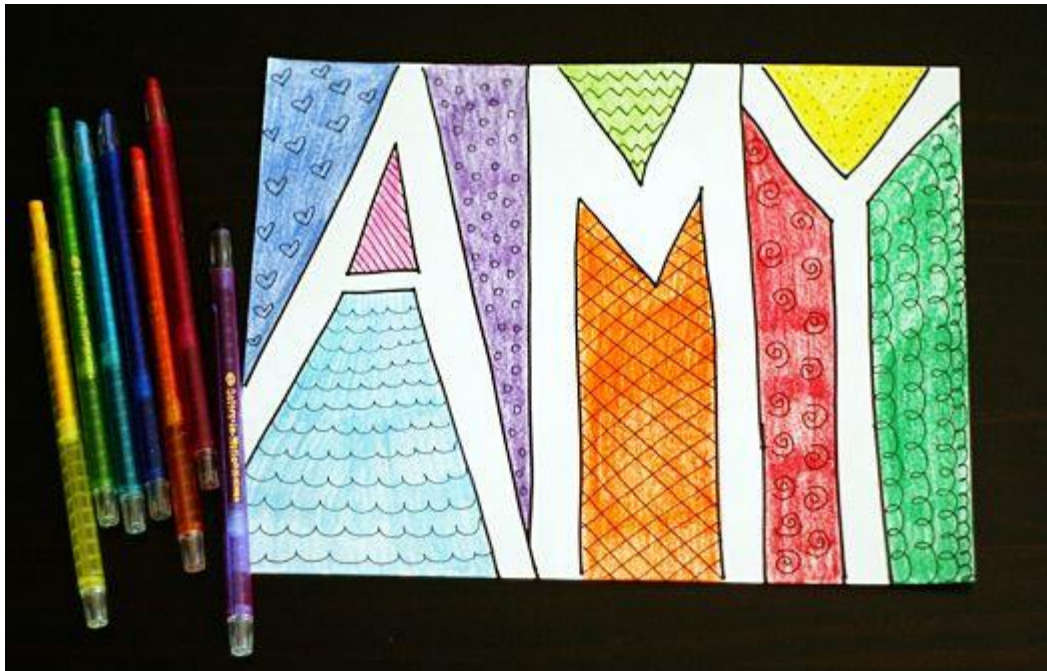
Materials needed

- 1 pencil
- 1 black crayon or black sharpie
- Set of crayons or colored pencils
- 1 piece 9 x 12 white construction paper

Introduction

For this lesson students will first listen to a read aloud of the book, *Bad Case of Stripes*, by David Shannon. If you have a copy of this book feel free to follow along. Here is the link <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AlqIbLdAYOw>

Steps

1. Following the story, please write your first name on the paper in pencil. Please make sure that each letter is written to fill the paper from top to bottom, order to help you

complete the coloring portion of the project. It may be helpful to use a ruler to guide letter placement.

2. Trace over your name in black sharpie or crayon.
3. For this next part it is helpful to think of the paper being divided into different sections with each letter being its own color design. Pick a different color to shade in each letter of your name. You may add a design or pattern around each letter for example using stripes or polka dots in a pattern. Remember to take your time, shading in the entire area of each letter. You are finished with the coloring portion when you have filled in all the letters of your name.
4. Remember to have fun, there are no mistakes in art!

Extensions

Feel free to make colorful name tags for other members of your family, pets included.
