The purpose of this lesson is to make a colorful name tag to put on display in your distance learning area.

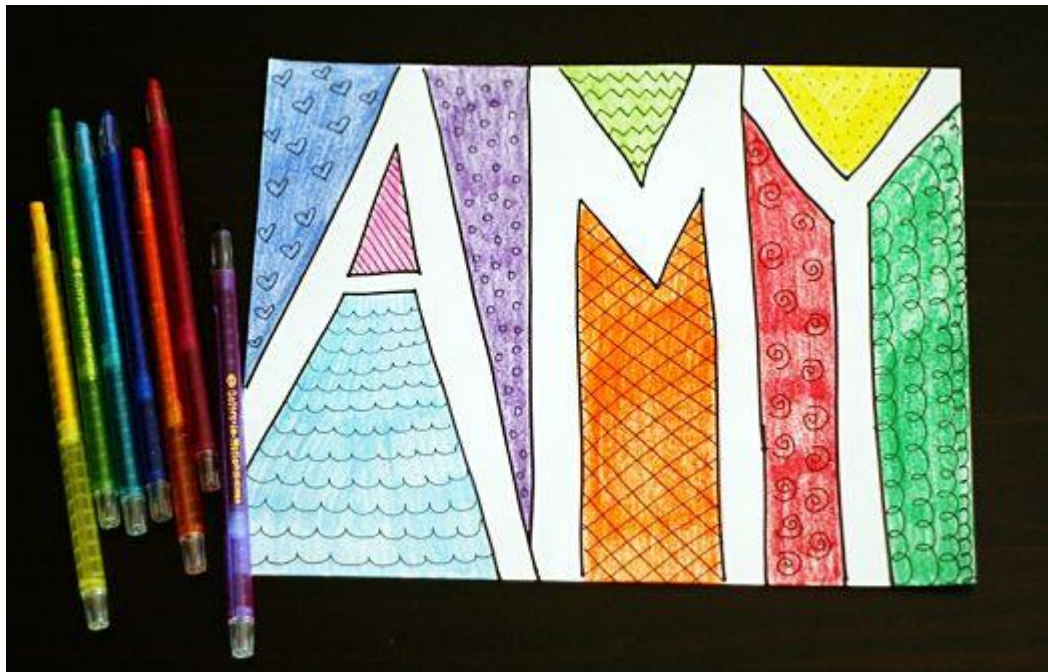
Materials needed

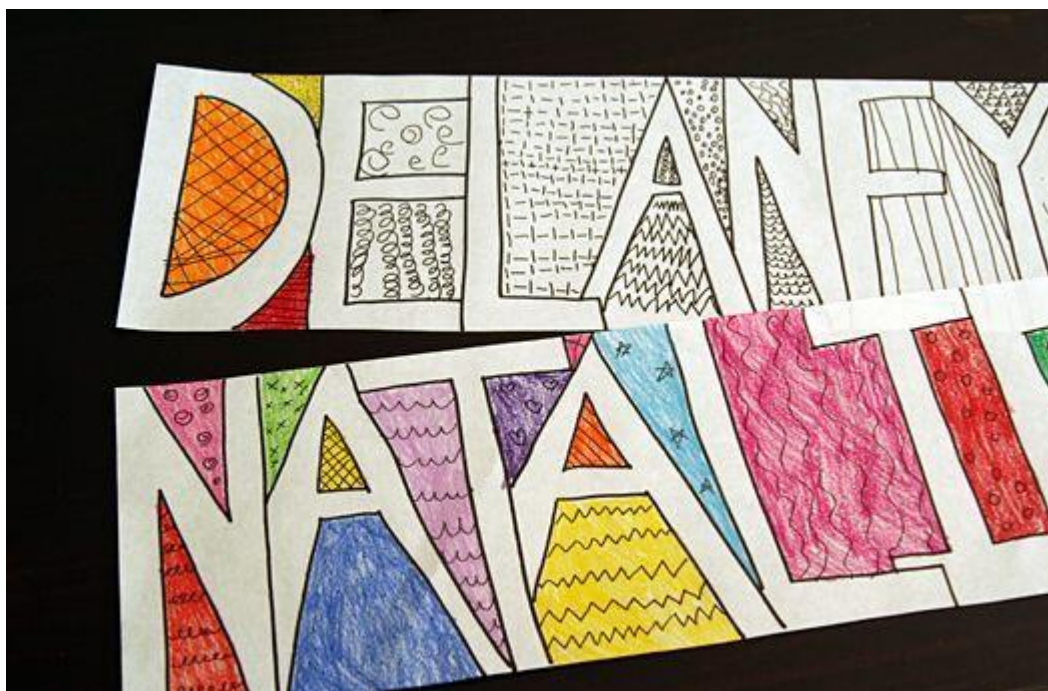
- 1 pencil
- 1 black sharpie
- Set of colored pencils
- 1 piece 9 x 12 white construction paper
- 1 ruler, optional

Introduction

For this lesson you will first listen to a reading of the book, *Bad Case of Stripes*, by David Shannon. If you have a copy of this book feel free to follow along. Here is the link <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AlqlbLdAYOw>

Steps

1. Following the story, please write your first name on the paper in pencil. You may choose to either write in all capitals, bubble letters or a variation of letter styles.
2. Please make sure that each letter is written to fill the paper from top to bottom in order to help you complete the detailed design/shading portion of the project. It may be helpful to use a ruler to guide letter placement.
3. Next trace over your name in black sharpie.
4. For this next part it is helpful to think of the paper being divided into different sections with each letter being its own color design. Pick a different color to shade in each letter of your name. You may add a design or pattern around each letter. Some examples include using stripes or polka dots in a pattern. Remember to take your time, shading in the entire area of each letter. You are finished with the design/shading portion when you have filled in all the letters of your name.
5. Remember to have fun, there are no mistakes in art!

Feel free to make colorful name tags for other members of your family, pets included.
