Class-Artists in Action Grades 6-8 Lesson-Tree Art Teacher-Kaleen Chatigny

The purpose of this lesson to teach students a variety of techniques to paint autumn trees.

Materials

1 pencil

1 black sharpie

1 set of watercolor, tempura or acrylic paints

9 x 12 piece of construction paper

Several Q-tips

Introduction

September 22 is the first day of autumn. You may have noticed many leaves in your area beginning to change color during this time of the year. Take a few minutes to walk around your yard or neighborhood to collect a variety of colorful leaves for inspiration.

I have included two different links with suggestions on ways to paint an autumn tree. One technique is using Q-tips instead of a paintbrush. While another technique is to put the paint directly on your paper and then use your brush to move the paint around the paper.

Steps

- 1. First draw the outline of your tree trunk and a variety of branches around your tree.
- 2. Next outline your tree in black sharpie, then either shade in the trunk in colored pencil or paint the trunk.
- 3. Then decide if you are going to use Q-tips or paint brushes to put the leaves on your paper. Feel free to use greens, reds, oranges, yellows or variations of autumn colors.
- 4. Once you have your leaves use a water color wash to put in a background sky and green grass around the base of the trunk.

Extension

Feel free to paint a second autumn tree using thumbprints or any type of round brush you have to paint a variety of leaves on your tree.
