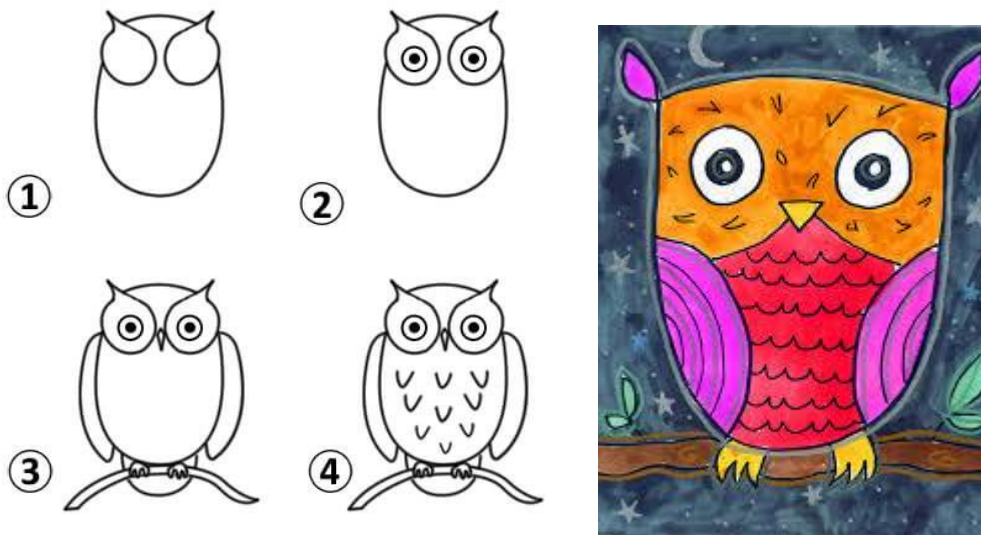
The purpose of this lesson is to show students how to draw an owl using a step-by-step approach. The final product of this lesson would look great placed at your child's art or school area.

Materials needed

- 1 pencil
- 1 black crayon
- Set of crayons
- 9 x 12 white construction paper

Introduction

For this lesson students will first listen to a read aloud of the book *Owl Babies*, by Martin Waddell. If you have a copy of this book feel free to follow along. Here is the link <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TPQRiSTYFH0>

#### Steps

1. Following the story, please help your child first look at the four steps to drawing an owl in the example shown above. It may help to lightly draw the owl shape on the paper in pencil for your child.
2. Next have your child trace over the pencil outline in black crayon.
3. For this next part have your child color in their owl. I have included an example with fun color choices.
4. Remember to have fun, there are no mistakes in art!

#### Extensions

Feel free to help your child draw owl babies on another piece of paper.

There are many other wonderful owl picture books you may enjoy reading with your child.
